Neighbourhood dialogue

Dear Neighbours,

The start of operations of the new Fire and Rescue Station 1 has involved a lot of measures to ensure things run as smoothly as possible. Noise levels are controlled not only by various building measures but also by a new light signal control system which can deploy vehicles in response to an alarm without using sirens. Whether responding to a fire, a road accident, someone injured or flood water threatening properties over several days on end -Hannover's fire department is always quick to help and plays an important role in the provision of public services and community infrastructure. In order to ensure help is quickly at hand, our vehicles have to be able to leave safely and without obstruction. This is why no-parking zones have been established along our access routes. These traffic measures are necessary and we ask for your understanding.

The new Fire and Rescue Station 1 will have an open day in the autumn of this year. We will organise this "Day for neighbourhood dialogue" once the new station is fully equipped and operational: we'll let you know as soon as possible. The open day will give you the chance to look behind the scenes of a modern city fire station.

Introducing the new Fire and Rescue Station 1

The new building has been built to provide preventive protection from fires and hazards

together with rescue services: it includes a wash/disinfection hall for the emergency

vehicles. The first phase is designed for approx. 100 staff. Three watches work in shifts to

provide 19 operational functions around the clock, 24/7 (including weekends and public

holidays). 10 staff (male and female) make up the day shift. The vehicle halls provide space

for up to 20 emergency service vehicles.

The investments in building phase 1 of the new of the fire and rescue station amount to

Euro 10 million plus VAT. Work started on 13 May 2013 with the site for the civil engineering

work. The first building phase provides about 4400 square metres of space. Project

principal and responsible for project management is the facility management department of

Hannover State Capital. struhk architekten of Braunschweig provided planning and

construction management services.

Completion and commissioning of the second phase is scheduled for 2017. This second

phase will house the Hannover regional coordination centre, the Hannover Police HQ

command centre as well as other functional services of the fire department.
