Dear parents, dear legal guardians,

the fourth and last year level of primary school is when you will be carefully considering which secondary school might be the right one for your child.

The State Capital of Hannover's secondary education system is very diverse and sophisticated. All types of secondary school – General Secondary (Oberschule), Streamed Secondary (Realschule), Comprehensive Secondary (Integrierte Gesamtschule), and Academic Secondary School (Gymnasium) – are working continually to further develop their educational profiles.

Secondary schools constantly respond to ever-changing societal challenges, and on the demands placed on a contemporary and future-proof education system, by providing special language programmes, by working towards inclusive education, by offering a range of focus streams, full-day programming, and much more. To help you avoid losing track of all this diversity, we have collated core information about the education options offered by secondary schools in the State Capital of Hannover.

You will find that all school types on offer will enable your child to obtain secondary school qualifications leading to further educational opportunities. I would therefore like to expressly encourage you not to view selecting a secondary school type for grades 5 and following as a 'life choice', but as a choice that is the right one for right now, meaning for this particular transition to year level 5. Please talk to your child's primary school teacher about which school type might be the most appropriate for your child. It is impossible to miss out: regardless of the type of school your child attends to continue its education in year level 5, all opportunities to obtain school-leaving certificates qualifying for further education remain available to them at the end of year levels 9 and 10 respectively.

I hope you enjoy reading this brochure, and I wish you and your child all the best for the start into secondary school education.

WHICH SCHOOL IS RIGHT FOR MY CHILD?

After completing year level 4 of primary school, your child/children will attend a secondary school in the following school year. For parents and legal guardians, this change of school means that, together with your child/children, you must select a school type as well as an individual school. You can choose freely among all available types of secondary school.

We expressly recommend that you discuss which type of school may be suitable for your child/children with the primary school your child attends. During year level 4, teachers offer appointments to inform you about your child's individual educational development, and to discuss selecting a secondary school with you. Many primary schools organise evening information sessions about the transition to secondary school, and also promote the 'sneak-peek-days' (Schnuppertage) offered by these schools in the spring. In addition, secondary schools also have an open day (Tag der offenen Tür), on which the respective school introduces itself to the public. You can find the date for the 'Tag der offenen Tür' on the school's website, or by contacting the school's administration office.

- 3 General Secondary Schools (Oberschulen, OBS)
- 5 Streamed Secondary Schools (Realschulen, RS)
- 2 Schools with special educational profiles

(Schulen mit besonderem pädagogischen Profil, SbpP)

17 Academic Secondary Schools (Gymnasien, GY)

11 Comprehensive Secondary Schools (Integrierte Gesamtschulen, IGS) In addition, independent schools (Schulen in freier Trägerschaft) may also be selected.

HOW DO I ENROL MY CHILD AT THE NEW SCHOOL?

There are fixed enrolment dates every spring, and these vary somewhat from year to year. You can find out the enrolment dates directly from your primary school, or online at <u>www.hannover.de/AnmeldungKlasse5</u>.

For the coming school year of 2023/24, there will again be two separate sets of enrolment dates. The enrolment dates for Comprehensive Secondary Schools (Integrierte Gesamtschulen) and independent schools (Schulen in freier Trägerschaft) are always scheduled before the enrolment dates for all other school types, including General Secondary (Oberschule), Streamed Secondary (Realschule), Academic Secondary School (Gymnasium), and schools with special educational profiles (Schulen mit besonderem pädagogischen Profil).

Enrolment – on the basis of the child's primary school report for the first term (Halbjahreszeugnis) of year 4 – is only possible at **one** school of your choice. On the enrolment form for this school, you can indicate additional schools as alternative preferences. You will receive an acceptance or rejection letter from the school after about one week. If you had opted for enrolment at a Comprehensive Secondary School (Integrierte Gesamtschule) or independent school (Schule in freier Trägerschaft) in the first instance, you now have the opportunity to make another selection and **enrol at a General Secondary / Streamed Secondary / Academic Secondary School (Oberschule / Realschule / Gymnasium) as part of the second set of enrolment dates.** You would then have to request to have the original copy of the first term primary school report returned to you, and to cancel the initial enrolment.

You can find the enrolment forms on the website of the school you selected. Please read any notes provided about how to submit the enrolment forms. Depending on the school, forms may have to be submitted in person, by post, or by email.

FURTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT SELECTION AND ENROLMENT

■ In contrast to primary schools, secondary schools do not have fixed school districts, which means that you are not entitled to be allocated a place at a school near your place of residence. The entire area of the City of Hannover is considered the school district. If the distance between your place of residence and the school exceeds 2 km, your child will receive a free student ticket (SchülerCard) for public transport.

• Comprehensive Schools (Integrierte Gesamtschulen) are not part of the regular school system (Regelschulen). They are instead classed as 'fixed-supply' schools (Angebotsschulen). According to state schools legislation (Niedersächsisches Schulgesetz, NSchG), this school type can only be selected on the basis of the available places. Should you not be allocated a place at this type of school, you would have to enrol your child at one of the schools within the regular system (Regelschulen), such as General Secondary, Streamed Secondary, or Academic Secondary School (Oberschule, Realschule, Gymnasium). During the regular enrolment cycles conducted to date however, all enrolments for Comprehensive Secondary Schools (Integrierte Gesamtschulen) were accepted. It now and then happens during the enrolment cycle that individual schools are selected more frequently than others, which can lead to their intake capacity being exceeded. Please note that your child/children are legally entitled to attendance at one of the school types included in the regular school system (Regelschule), such as General Secondary, Streamed Secondary, and Academic Secondary School (Oberschule, Realschule, Gymnasium), but not to attendance at a specific school. If a regular system school receives enrolments exceeding the available capacity, places are allocated, according to state schools legislation (Niedersächsisches Schulgesetz, NSchG), by drawing lots. For this reason, we recommend that you indicate your additional preferences for school allocation during enrolment.

• During a 'distribution conference', students not allotted their first preference for an individual school are distributed among the other schools of the selected type according to their additional preferences. This ensures that all children are attending a school of the type they selected.

■ The regulations governing the 'distribution conference' and the acceptance of your child's enrolment are determined by the schools and the regional authority for schools and education (Regionales Landesamt für Schule und Bildung, RLSB).

INCLUSIVE EDUCATION

All secondary schools are inclusive education schools. Joint learning (inclusion) means that students with and without additional educational support needs are learning together at the same school. Every school reserves at least five percent of all available year level 5 places for inclusive schooling.

If, during primary school, your child has been assessed as having additional educational support needs, you can also transfer to a supported learning school (Förderschule) for year level 5.

Supported learning schools (Förderschulen) are provided for all additional educational support needs. However, supported learning schools are no longer available for the support need 'learning support', as this school type has been discontinued since the 2021/2022 school year.

ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE

Most secondary schools in Hannover offer full-day programming (Ganztagsschule). For details on which schools offer full-day programming, please consult the information provided by the individual schools. Please also note that schools offer full-day programming in different modes:

Schools operating in **open full-day mode (offene Ganztagsschule)** generally offer these programmes after regular lessons. Participation in such extracurricular activities is voluntary. Students enrolling in this mode are then obliged to attend regularly for the duration of one or both school terms respectively.

At schools operating in **partially binding full-day mode (teilgebundene Ganztags-schule)**, students are obliged to attend for the full day on at least two days each week. On these days, lessons and extracurricular activities usually alternate (Rhythmisierung). On the other days, extracurricular activities are scheduled after regular lessons.

At schools operating in **binding full day-mode (voll gebundene Ganztagsschule)**, students are obliged to attend for the full day on more than three days per week. On these days, lessons and extracurricular activities alternate (Rhythmisierung).

CHANGING SCHOOL TYPE FOR UPPER SECONDARY LEVEL

Students who have obtained the extended secondary school certificate I (Erweiterter Sekundarabschluss I) at their school can transfer to year level 11 of an Academic Secondary (Gymnasium) or Comprehensive Secondary School (Integrierte Gesamtschule, IGS) if they are aiming for a matriculation certificate (Abitur). There, they must take up a beginners' course in a compulsory second additional language subject if they have not yet attended classes in a second additional language. The 'Abitur' matriculation certificate qualifying for university study can be attained at both school types, Academic Secondary School (Gymnasium) and Comprehensive Secondary School (Integrierte Gesamtschule) after a total of 13 years of schooling.

NEW TO HANNOVER?

The Schools Section (Fachbereich Schule) of the State Capital of Hannover's Education Bureau (Bildungsbüro) offers children and adolescents who have recently moved to Hannover **initial advice and information sessions (schulische Erstberatung)** regarding questions of schooling and education, and support with finding school places. This service is provided in close coordination with the Regional Authority for Schools and Education (Regionales Landesamt für Schule und Bildung, RLSB), and with relevant schools in Hannover. Newly arrived students receive information about the German language acquisition support that schools offer to students with languages of origin other than German. Language acquisition support forms part of continuous language education across subjects, as well as being a component of school-based programmes and support plans.

FINISHED SCHOOL – WHAT NOW?

In compliance with a decree issued by the Ministry for Culture, all school types offer their students career services from as early as year level 7. This helps prepare students for their transition into life after finishing school. Schools offer work experience placements, job application training, competency assessment, and numerous other job-related services to support your children in making career choices.

GENERAL SECONDARY SCHOOL (OBERSCHULE)

As a type of lower secondary school, General Secondary School (Oberschule) comprises year levels 5 to 10. At the school's discretion, lessons can be offered at a range of performance levels simultaneously within the same class group. This school type offers students with a range of performance potentials opportunities to learn with and from each other within a manageable framework.

The **compulsory additional language subject** at General Secondary School (Oberschule) is English. In year levels 6 to 10, this school type offers an elective programme, which generally consists of four weekly periods across all year levels. From year level 6, students participate


- either in a continuing elective course in a second additional language at four periods per week, or
- in two elective courses at two weekly periods each, chosen from a range of other subjects offered by the school.

This school type offers year level 9 and 10 students to develop, according to their performance ability and inclination, a major study focus languages, economics, technology, or health and social affairs.

General Secondary Schools (Oberschulen) offer a job-readiness focus with career guidance and vocational education interventions with collaborative partners such as vocational colleges, the career counselling services of the Federal Employment Agency (Arbeitsagentur), chambers of commerce and trade guilds, and especially with workplaces offering apprenticeships/traineeships and complementary training providers. These measures include: work experience placements and workplace tours, course work provided in collaboration with vocational colleges, work practice projects, and practice-oriented learning components within course subjects. Career guidance services are offered from year level 7, and career guidance and vocational education services from year level 9, according to study focus. These services are provided on a total of at least 60 days, and for students selecting a study focus profile on a total of at least 30 days. The following **school-leaving certificates** can be obtained at the end of year level 10:

- Extended Secondary Education Certificate I (Erweiterter Sekundarabschluss I). This certificate qualifies for admission to the introductory stage of upper secondary (gymnasiale Oberstufe) at a general Academic Secondary School (Gymnasium), at a Comprehensive Secondary School (Integrierte Gesamtschule), or at a vocational Academic Secondary School (berufliches Gymnasium).
- Secondary Education Certificate I Streamed Secondary School Certificate (Sekundarabschluss I – Realschulabschluss)
- Secondary Education Certificate I General Secondary School Certificate (Sekundarabschluss I – Hauptschulabschluss).

The General Secondary School Certificate (Hauptschulabschluss) can be obtained at the end of year level 9.

STREAMED SECONDARY SCHOOL (REALSCHULE)

Streamed Secondary School (Realschule) comprises year levels 5 to 10. It offers students an extended basic education as well as general career guidance, and students can develop an individual study focus by selecting course profiles. The **compulsory additional language subject** at Streamed Secondary Schools (Realschulen) is English. A second additional language subject (generally French) is offered as an elective at four periods per week from year 6. Students who do not select a second additional language subject attend lessons in two other elective subjects at two periods per week each.

Learning a second additional language from year 6 is not a prerequisite for potential transition to the introductory stage of upper secondary level (gymnasiale Oberstufe) at a general Academic Secondary School, nor for attending a vocational Academic Secondary School (berufliches Gymnasium). However, a second additional language subject is a prerequisite for transferring to an Academic Secondary School (Gymnasium) at an earlier stage.

Career guidance services are provided in the form of day workshops (Praxistage) on a total of at least 30 days, primarily in years 8 to 10. In year level 8, these also serve as preparation for the selection of course profiles in years 9 and 10. **Career guidance** is provided in collaboration with partners such as vocational colleges, the Federal Employment Agency (Arbeitsagentur), chambers of commerce and trade guilds, and especially workplaces offering apprenticeships/traineeships together with vocational education providers.


These measures include: career counselling, work experience placements, workplace tours, course work provided in collaboration with vocational colleges, work practice projects, and practice-oriented learning components within course subjects.

At Streamed Secondary Schools (Realschulen) with at least two streams, students can choose between major and minor courses in mathematics and English, or in one of the subjects offered from year 9.

The following school-leaving certificates can be obtained at the end of year level 10:

Extended Secondary Education Certificate I (Erweiterter Sekundarabschluss I). This certificate qualifies for admission to the introductory stage of upper secondary level (gymnasiale Oberstufe) at a general Academic Secondary School (Gymnasium), at a Comprehensive Secondary School (Integrierte Gesamtschule), or at a vocational Academic Secondary School (berufliches Gymnasium).

The Capital of Hannover offers two schools with special educational profiles. Both schools also offer primary school education. The Glockseeschule Hannover generally does not enrol new students in year level 5. The Südstadtschule Hannover, however, does conduct year level 5 enrolments.

ACADEMIC SECONDARY SCHOOL (GYMNASIUM)

Academic Secondary School (Gymnasium) comprises year levels 5 to 13. Academic Secondary Schools offer their students a broad as well as deep basic education, and enable them to develop a general ability to study at university. They strengthen independent learning and introduce the processes of academic study. Academic Secondary Schools allow their students to develop an individual study focus according to their performance ability and inclinations. Lessons at year levels 5 to 10 consist, at each school's discretion, of compulsory subjects, elective subjects, and voluntary subjects.

In principle, English is the first **compulsory additional language** (years 5 to 10) at Academic Secondary Schools. A second additional language subject is compulsory from year 6. Specific study focus areas may be offered at year levels 8 to 10. Successful attendance at year level 10 entitles students to enter the introductory stage of upper secondary education.


Upper secondary level at Advanced Secondary Schools comprises year levels 11 to 13. It is divided into a one-year introductory stage (year 11) and a two-year qualification stage (years 12 and 13). It concludes after 13 years of schooling with the matriculation examination (Abitur).

Teaching at year level 11 is in class groups, and during the qualification stage in course groups. At the end of year 11, students select a subject profile reflecting their individual study focus (focus subjects). Students retain their chosen combination of subjects until the 'Abitur' examination.

Students can choose between a language and a science focus. Depending on the subjects offered by the individual school, a social science, music and arts, or sports study focus is also possible. Irrespective of their selection, students must study three core subjects throughout: German, an advanced course in an additional language, and mathematics.

In addition to their focus subjects and core subjects, students study complementary and elective subjects, as well as a project-based learning subject.

Students leaving Academic Secondary School after year 10 can obtain all available standard lower secondary level **qualifications**. The general matriculation certificate qualifying for university study (allgemeine Hochschulreife) can be obtained by passing the 'Abitur' examination at the end of the qualification stage. Students leaving before (at the end of the first year of the qualification stage at the earliest) – or failing – their matriculation examination can obtain the school-based component of the special matriculation certificate qualifying for specific forms of university study (Fachhochschulreife) as long as minimum requirements are met. The main **career guidance** activities at Academic Secondary Schools include work experience placements, workplace tours, as well as the career and tertiary education guidance services provided by the Federal Employment Agency (Agentur für Arbeit), including preparatory and post-intervention support activities. Work experience placements of ten to 15 school days in form of a block placement, which are generally completed in a private sector workplace or other organisation.

COMPREHENSIVE SECONDARY SCHOOL (INTEGRIERTE GESAMTSCHULE)

Depending on the individual school, Comprehensive Secondary Schools either include year levels 5 to 13, or 5 to 10. According to Lower Saxony schools legislation (Niedersächsisches Schulgesetz, NSchG), enrolment restrictions at Comprehensive Secondary Schools only apply to lower secondary level. This means that students are not necessarily guaranteed a place at this school type.

At this type of school, students with a range of performance potentials learn with and from each other. Students are taught by teachers of all school types, following a shared curriculum. To recognise individual learning progress, students receive either learning development reports or marked school reports. The 'Schools for Everyone' educational concept for lower secondary education at Comprehensive Secondary Schools is characterised by support as well as challenge in the teaching of individual subjects, and by methodology-focused and social learning across the educational process.


In year levels 5 and 6, class groups stay together for all lessons. From year level 7, some subjects are taught in separate groups forming performance-based streams (äußere Fachleistungsdifferenzierung). Performance-based streaming applies to mathematics and English from year level 7, German from year level 8, and the sciences from year level 9.


Electives are offered from year levels 7 or 9, depending on what each individual school is able to offer. Students can use electives to form their own study focus profile according to their personal inclinations. The compulsory additional language subject at Comprehensive Secondary Schools is English. From year level 6, all interested students can learn a second additional language.

All basic education **school-leaving certificates** available at the end of year level 10, as well as the matriculation certificate qualifying for university study, can be obtained at the five large Comprehensive Secondary Schools that include an upper secondary level (Sekundarstufe II): IGS Bothfeld, IGS Kronsberg, IGS Linden, Leono-re-Goldschmidt-Schule-IGS Hannover-Mühlenberg, IGS Roderbruch, IGS Südstadt and IGS Büssingweg, including an upper secondary level shared with IGS List and IGS Vahrenheide/Sahlkamp.

Career guidance is provided in collaboration with partners such as vocational colleges, the Federal Employment Agency (Arbeitsagentur), chambers of commerce and trade guilds, and especially workplaces offering apprenticeships/traineeships together with vocational education providers.

Interventions include career guidance, work experience placements, workplace tours, course work provided in collaboration with vocational colleges, and practice-oriented learning units within course subjects. In this area, Comprehensive Secondary Schools are guided by the type-specific interventions of other school types offering basic education.




