
Witness Accounts Round 3






I hate it, when rubbish is not separated properly! In the residual waste in front of the venue I found some torn paper earlier. But that belongs in the blue bin, doesn't it!




I saw Jane rush out of the room at half past seven. And then I saw Andrew go to the bathroom at a quarter to eight. He did not return until around eight.
